









Trade Policy in 2001:

Free Trade Area of the Americas – FTAA

- Proposed free-trade zone encompassing all of the Americas;
- Was to include all countries of North America, South America and of the Caribbean with the exception of Cuba;
- Negotiations ended in failure; the state parties unable to reach an agreement by the 2005 deadline they had set;







Brazil Economic Growth 2007 – 2010 (GDP)

- Fueled by global demand for commodities

2007: 6%

2008: 5%

2009: - 0.13% (Financial crisis)

2010: 7.5%





Canada – Brazil: Back on Track

- 2010: Brazil and Canada sign the Science, Technology and Innovation (STI) Agreement; to promote collaboration between partners from industry, academia and government;
- 2012: Launch of the Strategic Partnership Dialogue (SPD) between Foreign Ministers;
- 2018: Beginning of negotiations for a Canada Mercosul (Argentina, Uruguay, Paraguay, Brazil) Free Trade Agreement;





Canada – Brazil: Education sector, a success story

- A growing strength in the bilateral relations; in 2022, there were 19,460 Brazilian students in Canada with study permits;
- In 2019, approximately 25,000 students pursued short-term language study in Canada;
- Total of 40,000 Brazilians who studied in Canada that year and making Canada the number one international destination for Brazilian students


So where are we now...

- Areas of contentions: Government procurement and environmental protection measures; lessons for Canada;



Still, Canada – Brazil trade increasing...








Canada – Brazil:

Record trade in 2022

- Merchandise trade totaled US\$10.5 billion in 2022, an increase of more than 40% when compared to 2021. And an even higher increase of 614% when compared to 2001
- Two-way trade in services in 2022 was US\$1.4 billion, with services exports of \$1.05 billion and imports of services US\$ 332 million
- Increase largely due to sale of fertilizers (Ukrainian crisis)




CANADA EXPORTS

Provides infrastructure to register and operate Canadian companies in a rich networking environment and navigate the Brazilian business ecosystem






The Brazil Hub
